1. Codex Alimentarius which was initiated in the early 1960's by the World Health Organization (WHO which is a United Nations program). Originally Codex Alimentarius was formed to create standards in world trade and later became a program to restrict access to food supplements and control our personal choices about what we eat.
2. Updated information regarding local application of "Smart Growth" and UN Agenda 21 in Hot Springs; it's relationship to the 2030 Plan and invasion of our property rights.
3. The North American Federation, which you learned about via the video "United We Fall." That federation is designed to remove the boundaries between Canada, USA and Mexico. If you haven't seen the video, copies are available at our meetings.

Monday, Jan 16th, was a holiday so no county meetings were held. At a previous meeting, I questioned if the money from the Arkansas Fish and Game Commission, that is given to Garland County schools, had any accountability as to how it was spent? The AG&F shares a portion of fines that are collected in each Arkansas county with that counties' schools. This year the amount was about \$19,000. This gives each school district about \$2700. The money is supposed to be spent on something to support outdoor education efforts. The practice of writing a check with no questions asked, is a poor practice at best. This year the county judge will issue a letter asking what the funds will be spent on -- we will report on the results.

Monday, January 23, The Human Resources Committee will meet at 5:00 PM. Room 200. This meeting will be better than most. If you have never attended a meeting, plan to attend.
